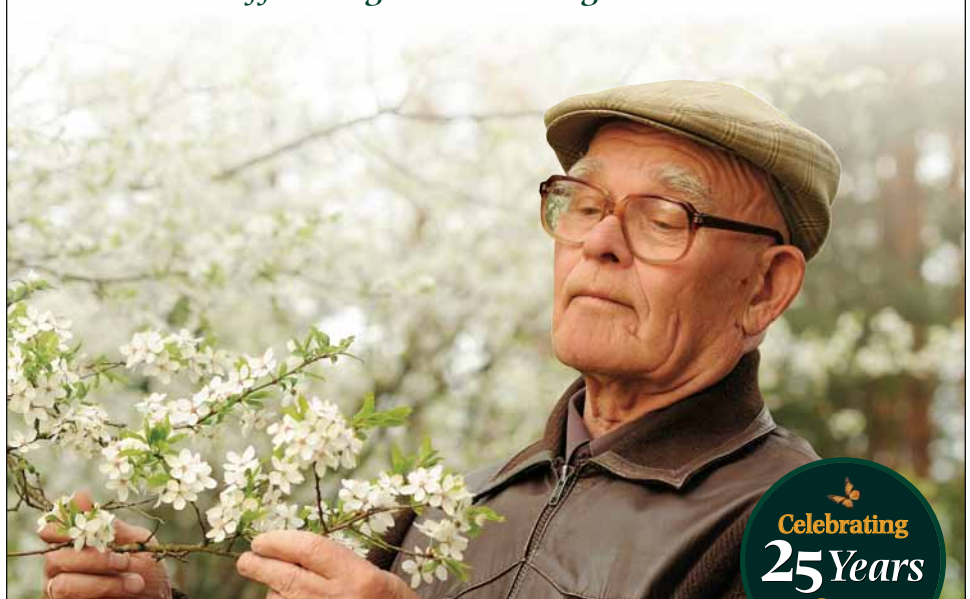

Village of Barrington Announces “101 West,” New Luxury Apartment Complex in the Village Center

THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON is pleased to announce that in early 2018, the former ADCO site (SW corner of North Hough Street and Liberty Street between the McGrath Volvo dealership and Paul's Burritos) will be the new home to 101 West, a beautiful, 64-unit luxury apartment community.

“We are so pleased to see this modern residential apartment complex being built on the former ADCO property,” says Peg Blanchard, the Village of Barrington’s Director of Economic Development. “These beautiful units will provide wonderful housing options for young couples, families, and older empty-nesters. The complex is within walking distance of the Village Center and will allow residents to enjoy all the activities, restaurants, and entertainment options that Barrington has to offer.”

BJWC's Safety Town Celebrates 20 Years

SAFETY TOWN REGISTRATION

A SAFETY PROGRAM offered by the National Safety Town Center in Ohio was brought to the attention of the Barrington Junior Women's Club (BJWC) in the mid-70s. What appealed to BJWC about the program was that it delivered safety lessons in both educational and real-world settings, allowing children to learn the skills and reinforce those skills with a hands-on approach. The importance of such a program was clear and the first sessions began the summer of 1975 at Hough Street School. Created on a small budget by anyone who could lend a hand, a small town of "tear-down buildings" and painted roads took over the playground by day and were stowed away in the school at night. Directors, volunteers, campers, and members of the BJWC took over the classrooms. In the 1990s, the program moved from Hough Street School to Grove Avenue Elementary, and it appeared that a permanent home was needed.

A Safety Town Task Force formed to find a permanent home. Headed by Karen Darch and Chris Griffin, the six-woman task force, made up of BJWC members, secured a location and classroom space at JFK Health World (now The Orchard Evangelical Free Church Barrington) as well as raised over \$115,000.00 in less than six months. On Aug. 24, 1997, Safety Town's permanent site was dedicated to the community who had come together to see this project through to completion.

While the world around us has changed a lot in the past 20 years, Safety Town still focuses on the core safety lessons, but with the addition of good touch/bad touch and weather safety. However, the way the directors and volunteers relate to the campers and the way the information is shared has changed. The materials and lessons presented to the campers are more interactive and hands-on through various games, read-alouds, and activities. In 2008, it was decided to offer four sessions that were two-and-a-half hours long instead of six sessions that were two hours long. This allowed children more time to learn and practice the safety skills presented each day. Also, the three director positions instituted a certified teachers requirement. The materials and lessons presented to the campers have changed to be more interactive and hands-on through various games, read-alouds, and activities.

Anniversary Celebration: The BJWC Safety Town permanent site's 20th anniversary celebration will be held on Sat., August 26. Just as the entire community came together 20 years ago to help build the site, the entire community is welcome to the celebration.



SAFETY TOWN 2017 SUMMER SESSIONS FOR CAMPERS AND VOLUNTEERS

BJWC Safety Town sessions run two weeks and meet Monday through Friday. Four sessions are offered in 2017: Session 1, June 12-23, 9 a.m.–11:30 a.m. / Session 2, June 12-23, 12:30–3 p.m. / Session 3, July 10-21, 9 a.m.–11:30 a.m. / Session 4, July 10-21, 12:30 p.m.–3 p.m.

Children who are entering kindergarten or first grade are eligible (must be five years old by Sept. 1, 2017) and have not previously participated in Safety Town are eligible to become 2017 BJWC Safety Town campers.

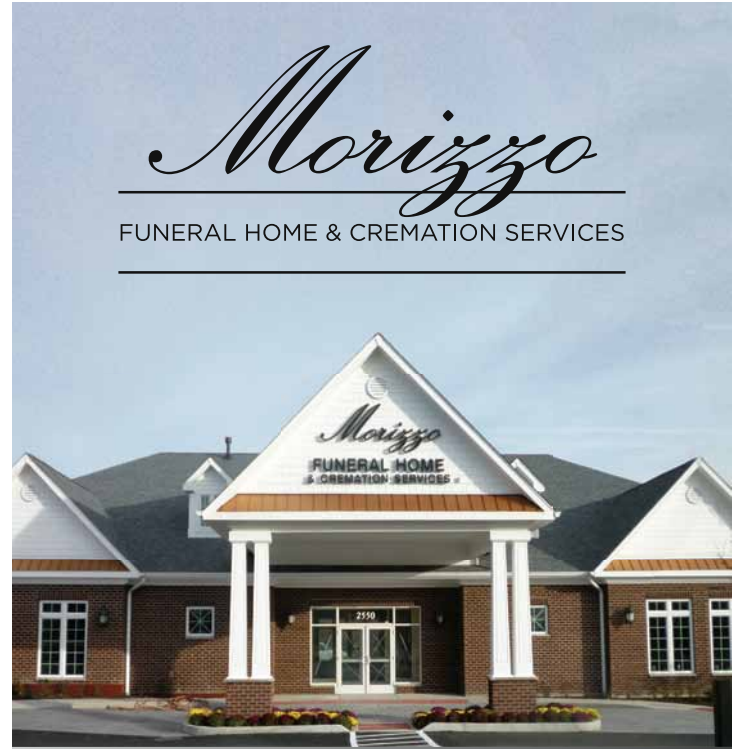
Let it Be Us Post Event Coverage

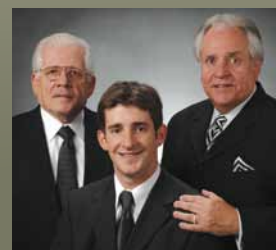
