

BJWC Recognizes 10 Local Leaders



Barrington Campus Life Center to Open






ON APRIL 27, COMMUNITY LEADERS, Barrington 220 School District administrators, teachers, and students attended the unveiling of plans for the new Barrington Campus Life Center. More than 70 people came to Barrington's White House to celebrate and support this new Center designed specifically for students.

Speakers included Brian McCaskey, member of the Board of Directors for the Chicago Bears; Chip Combs, of the Chicago Board of Trade, and Lance Murdock with Willow Creek Community Church. Staff members of Youth for Christ spoke about the need and importance of the Campus Life Center.

The Center is being built on Lageschulte St., just a few blocks from Barrington High School. It is scheduled to open for students this fall as a place where they can spend time with friends, get homework help and mentoring, find opportunities for volunteering, and enjoying social times such as dances, concerts, and weekly Campus Life meetings.

Youth for Christ (YFC) Chicago will manage and operate the building with staff members specially trained to build constructive relationships with students. The goal is to help them grow socially, emotionally, and spiritually. YFC has had a Campus Life ministry for students at Barrington High School for years, but has not had a consistent meeting place convenient to BHS. The Barrington Campus Life Center will solve that problem.

Youth for Christ Chicago is the local chapter of the international non-denominational ministry open to students aged 11 to 19 no matter their religious affiliation. YFC Chicago has 34 ministry sites from Valparaiso, Ind., to Cary-Grove High School. Youth For Christ was started in 1944 and now is in more than 120 countries and has over 160 chapters in the United States. 


Go Beyond Barrington Succeeds at Its Mission
