

MY MOTHER, MARY LEE, suffered for two years in pain barely even able to walk. She bravely went forward with knee surgery. After a long rehab, in the middle of the pandemic, my mother fell and broke her ankle on what she now called her good leg. She once again braved surgery, but this time no visitors allowed. After a stay in the hospital, she was moved to an assisted living facility for rehab and care. I spoke with my mother every day. However, I could see her optimistic spirit dwindle with the loss of the use of her foot and of the fear of the virus hovering over her.

As a teenager, she received a scholarship to The Art Institute of Chicago and then The Art Academy of Chicago. Her dream of becoming a professional artist was short-lived. Mary Lee would use her artistic skills to paint and draw pictures for family members to enjoy. She remained an artist at heart.

In the summer of 2020, I proposed a project to her: a children's book with characters from our family tree. I would compose the story and she would do most of the illustrations. It had been months since I had seen a smile. From that moment, our conversations centered around our project and the concept of putting a smile on children's faces as well as adult readers.



### BACC 2023 Scholarship Applications Now Available

APPLICATIONS FOR THE 2023 Lauren Brown Memorial Scholarship are now available from the Barrington Area Chamber of Commerce (BACC) at BarringtonChamber.com, or through the Chamber office located at 190 E. James St. in Barrington. Eligible students must be from the Barrington area, or the student of an employee of a Chamber member business.
