



POLO IS ALIVE AND WELL IN BARRINGTON HILLS

The 2021 LeCompte-Kalaway Cup Polo Matches Take Place Saturday, September 11 at Oakwood Farm

THE BARRINGTON HILLS POLO CLUB announces the return of its LeCompte/Kalaway Cup Polo Matches to be held Saturday, September 11, at the Oakwood Farm Polo Field in Barrington Hills. Originating in 2005, the LeCompte/Kalaway Cup has been held annually each September except for 2018 when it was cancelled because of rain and 2020 when it was shut down because of the pandemic.

According to event chair, Karen Selman, "We've been getting calls and inquiries for months asking if the annual polo matches will happen in 2021 and can people reserve tailgates?" Co-chair John Rosene reports that sponsors and advertisers have also been asking about the event since last year. "We are happy to finally announce the LeCompte/Kalaway Cup for 2021 is actually going to happen," Selman said.

Possibly the most important date on the area's social calendar, the LeCompte/Kalaway Cup is by far Chicagoland's largest single polo event. The event organizers take pride in featuring homegrown polo talent taking the field in a tremendous show of top amateur players, most of whom got their start in the nationally recognized polo school held annually by the Barrington Hills Polo Club. The event features two exciting polo matches: The popular Battle of the Sexes pitting a men's team vs. a woman's team, and the LeCompte/Kalaway Cup, a three team round robin vying for the coveted LeCompte/Kalaway Cup trophies.

Other attractions include demonstrations from the Fox River Valley Pony Club and the "Running of the Hounds" by the Fox River Valley Hunt Club, as well as a display of precision riding by a color guard by military veterans from BraveHearts and free hayrides around the polo field between matches.

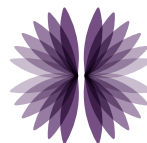

BHS Fine Arts Students' Talent Brings Joy to Others

NO ONE COULD HAVE ANTICIPATED how the Sherry family and the Barrington High School Fine Arts Department would intersect this past year. Marcia and Dan Sherry's three children attend Barrington schools. A few years ago, Marcia was diagnosed with early onset Alzheimer's disease.

As the Sherry family worked through the diagnosis, Dan wrote a song for Marcia about how they met and fell in love and searched for a way to share the song with her. The timing was difficult in a pandemic. Dan reached out to family friend Mary Beaubien who could network with talented young people to hopefully meet Dan's request. First, Mary's daughter, Annie Beaubien, a Theatre and Biology major at Northwestern University, recorded one of Dan's poems for his wife which provided the family some joy.

However, the Sherrys and Beaubiens still wanted to have Dan's song shared with his wife in a way which could reach her musically and emotionally. They connected with BHS Choir Director Brandon Pemberton and one of the school's a cappella groups, Premium Blend, (Mary's other daughter, BHS rising junior, Ella Beaubien, is a member).

Premium Blend A Cappella members worked with their choir teacher to arrange, learn, and record Dan's song in December 2020. The final video link of the performance was delivered to Dan and his family on Christmas Eve. For Marcia, the students' music elicited feelings and memories of years past. Sadly, she passed away two months later.

Dan created the *Barrington Parisian Affaire de Coeur Humanitarian Award* in memory of his wife. He hopes that the annual award will continue to inspire other young people to use their talents to give back to others. The first award was given to the students in Premium Blend and Mr. Pemberton at the BHS Choir banquet on May 18, 2021 by Dan and his three grown children.
